



CHECKLIST FOR ARTICLE-BASED OR COMBINED MASTER'S OR DOCTORAL THESIS

Your program allows article-based or combined theses, and your thesis meets all program-specific requirements

You are the first or co-first author of the paper, or, exceptionally, a co-author who has made a major and decisive contribution.

- You have obtained authorization from all co-authors.
- Signed [Co-authors Authorization Forms \(FES-100\)](#) for each paper must be transmitted to FESP at the time of thesis submission.
- If the article is published, these forms are not required once the publisher has authorized the insertion of the article in the thesis.

The paper was prepared

- in the course of your program
- as part of the research undertaken to fulfill your degree requirements (or both grades in the case of doctoral fast-track program)

If applicable, the publisher to whom you have transferred your copyright

- is informed that the paper is or will be included in the thesis
- gave permission for that use
- is hereby informed that the University Library and Library and Archives Canada make the dissertation available online
- has agreed to this diffusion
- has given written consent

In the **mandatory** preface containing the general disclosure regarding your [use of generative artificial intelligence \(AI\) tools](#) in your Master's or Doctoral thesis, you have added a second section presenting, for each article:

- publication status of the article (manuscript in preparation, submitted, accept, published)
- changes, if any, between the paper included and the published one
- the contribution, the exact role of each person when the article is co-first authored or co-authored

Each paper is a separate chapter.

It is preceded by :

- its publication title
- of its French abstract
- if applicable, a summary in the same language as the thesis (writing in a language other than French must be authorized by the research and program directors)
