FRONT MATTER	1. Title page	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The title page presentation must follow FESP rules (see templates). • If the Master's thesis or Doctoral thesis is written in a language other than French: The title of the Master's thesis or Doctoral thesis must be in the language the document is written in, but the other title page items must be in French. 	Do not paginate

Abstracts	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Abstracts must be written in French. • Length: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Maximum 300 words for a dissertation - Maximum 700 words for a thesis • For greater visibility in international databases, it is recommended that you include an English abstract after the French one. • Each abstract must be on a separate page. 	Pagination in Roman numerals The abstract corresponds to page ii.

7. Preface (<u>Compulsory for compilation and article-based theses and dissertations only</u>)	The preface will contain information on the publication status of the articles (submission, acceptance, or publication dates), differences between the integrated and published versions of the article (if any), your status as author (lead or supporting), your exact role in the preparation of each article, and the names of the coauthors of each article.

BODY OF THE THESIS OR DISSERTATION	8. Introduction, chapters, conclusion	<p>Each of the sections (introduction, chapter, conclusion) in the body of the thesis or dissertation must start on a new page.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Introduction <p>The introduction should not be identified as a chapter. It must be paginated. It must start on page 1.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Chapters <p>(must be numbered: chapter 1 + title, chapter 2 + title, etc.)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Conclusion <p>The conclusion should not be identified as a chapter.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use of articles <p>In an article-based or compilation thesis or dissertation, each article must be the subject of a separate chapter containing:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The original title of the article - An abstract in French (max. 150 words) - An abstract in the language the article is written in, if not in French. The abstracts must be listed in the table of contents in the same way as the other sections of the chapter in question. <p>Important</p> <p>The format of the article must match the overall format of the thesis or dissertation.</p> <p>The introduction and conclusion of the thesis or dissertation should highlight the coherency of the approach.</p> <p>Checklist for compilation and article-based manuscripts</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Citations <p>Put <u>short citations</u> in quotation marks ""</p> <p>For <u>long citations</u> (more than 5 lines)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Separate paragraph Single space 10 mm indentation on the left and right Without quotation marks and italics 	Continuous pagination in Arabic numerals is compulsory (including on integrated articles) and should continue after the conclusion (bibliography, appendices, etc.)
BIBLIOGRAPHY		FESP does not recommend any particular bibliographic style. The choice of bibliographic style should follow the standards in your field of study.	
APPENDICES		Depending on the discipline, appendices may be placed before the bibliography.	
		It is forbidden to reproduce a publication in its entirety (articles, conference proceedings, book chapters, etc.) in the appendix to a thesis or dissertation without the author's permission.	
		A good alternative is to include a bibliographic reference for the publication.	
Theses and dissertations should not contain any signatures or personal information (telephone numbers, addresses, etc.), nor any CÉRUL certificates.
